Nominated as 'Funniest Woman' (Loaded Awards), 'Best Female Stand-Up' (Chortle Awards) and one of *The 100 Greatest Stand-Ups* (Channel4), Jo Caulfield is one of the most successful and instantly recognised female comics in the UK.

Star of Radio 4's critically acclaimed *Jo Caulfield Won't Shut Up* and *It's That Jo Caulfield Again* and regularly seen on *Mock The Week*, *Have I Got News For You*, *Michael McIntyre's Comedy Roadshow*, *Never Mind The Buzzcocks*, *Argumental*, *Girls Who Do Comedy* and *The World Stands Up*.
